I, Melvin Clark Reese Jr., being of the age 40 years, hereby apply for membership in this Society by right of blood descent in the following line from John Gregg who was born in Washington on the day of 1847 and died in Loudoun Co., Virginia on the day of 1813, and who assisted in establishing American Independence. I was born in Los Angeles California on the 15th day of Oct. 1920.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

SECTION 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or more and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unfaithful in his life to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, and signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by covert act of resistance to the authority of Great Britain.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, and it is desired to file additional claims, separate applications on special forms provided for the purpose, should be made in each case and filed with the original. State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the evidence of ancestors, with dates of birth and death, if known. By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows: John Gregg served as a private in Capt. Gadden's Company Va. Militia, born in Washington Pa in 1747 and died 1813 in Loudoun County Va. Married Hannah Steer in 1775. Hannah Steer was born in 1751.
